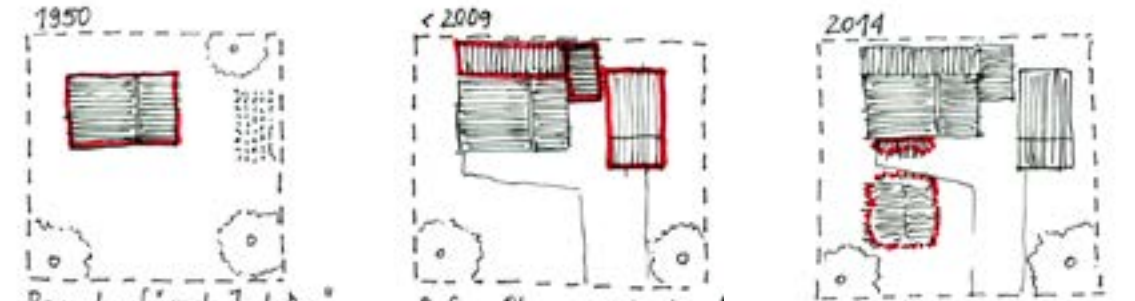




Sketch of day and night spaces' uses

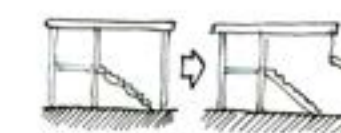
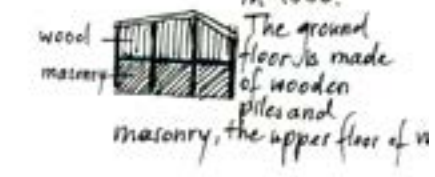
Sketches of house's growth

 2014: construction of a Lisu hut.



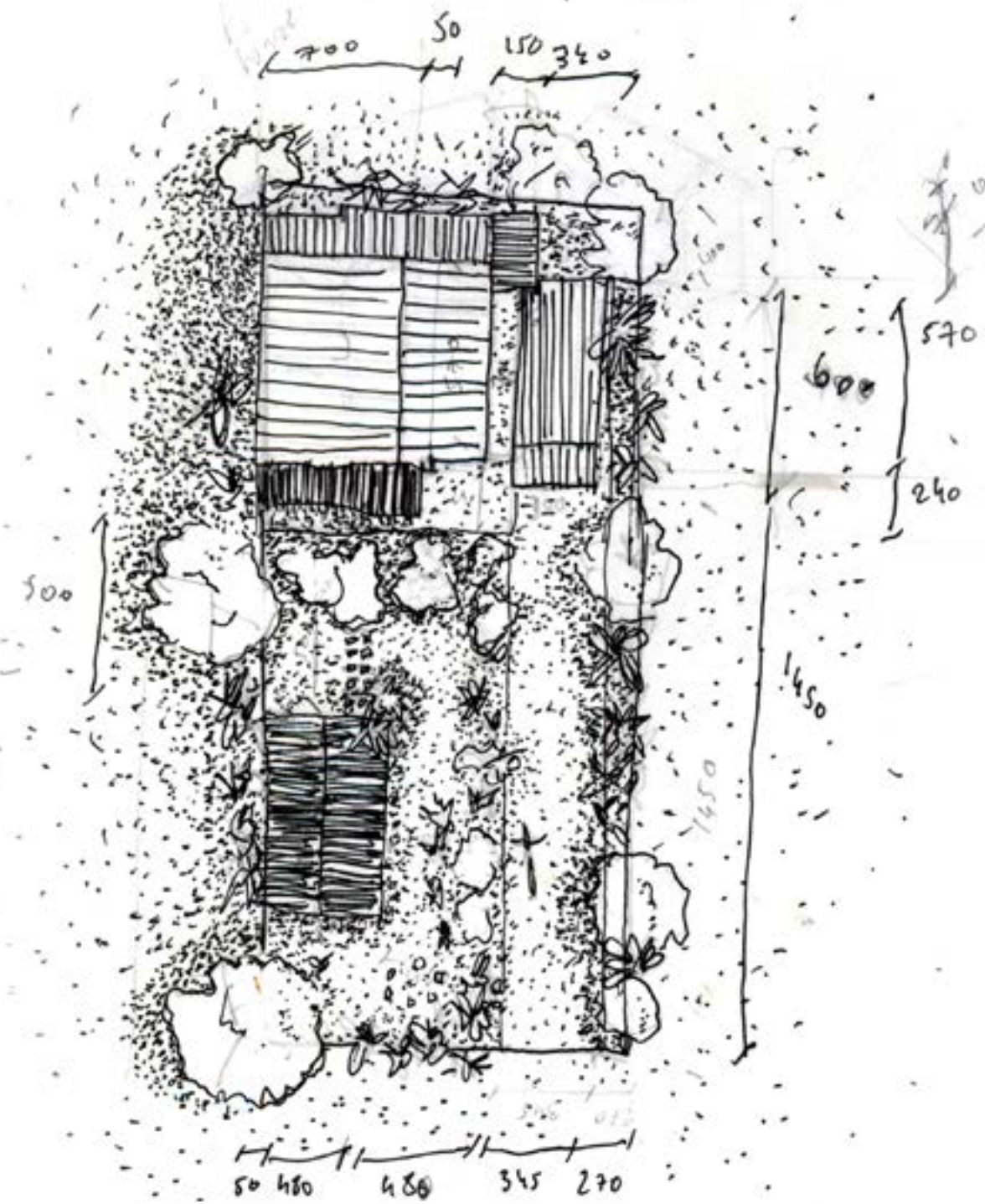
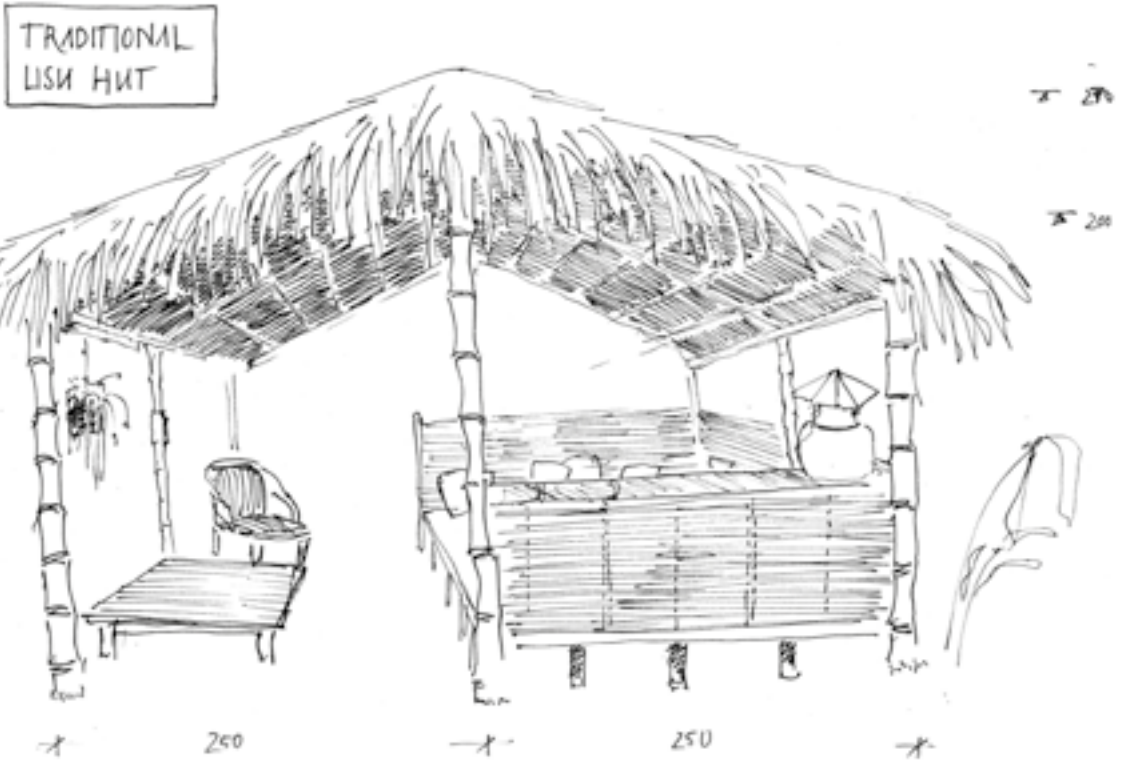

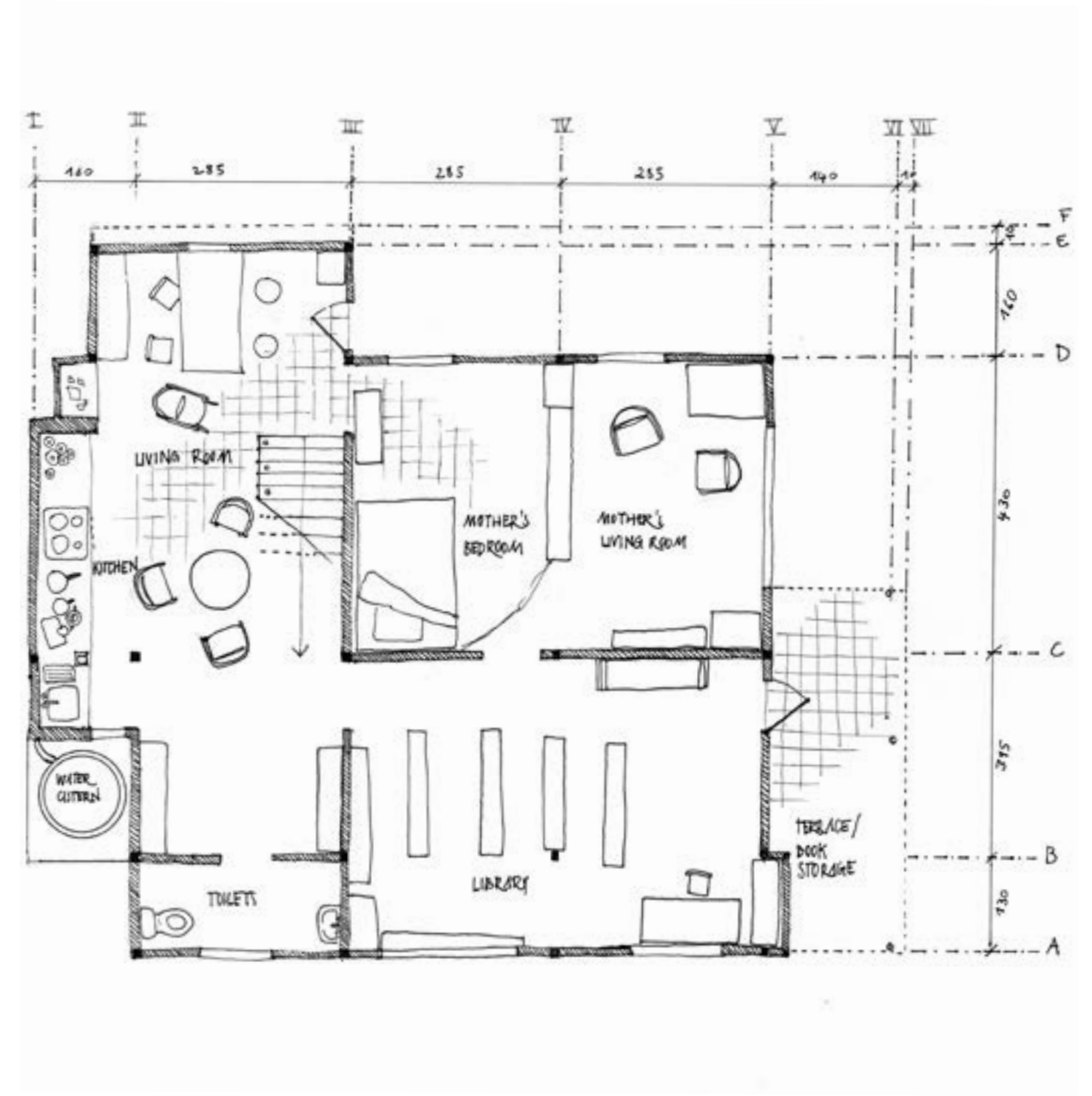
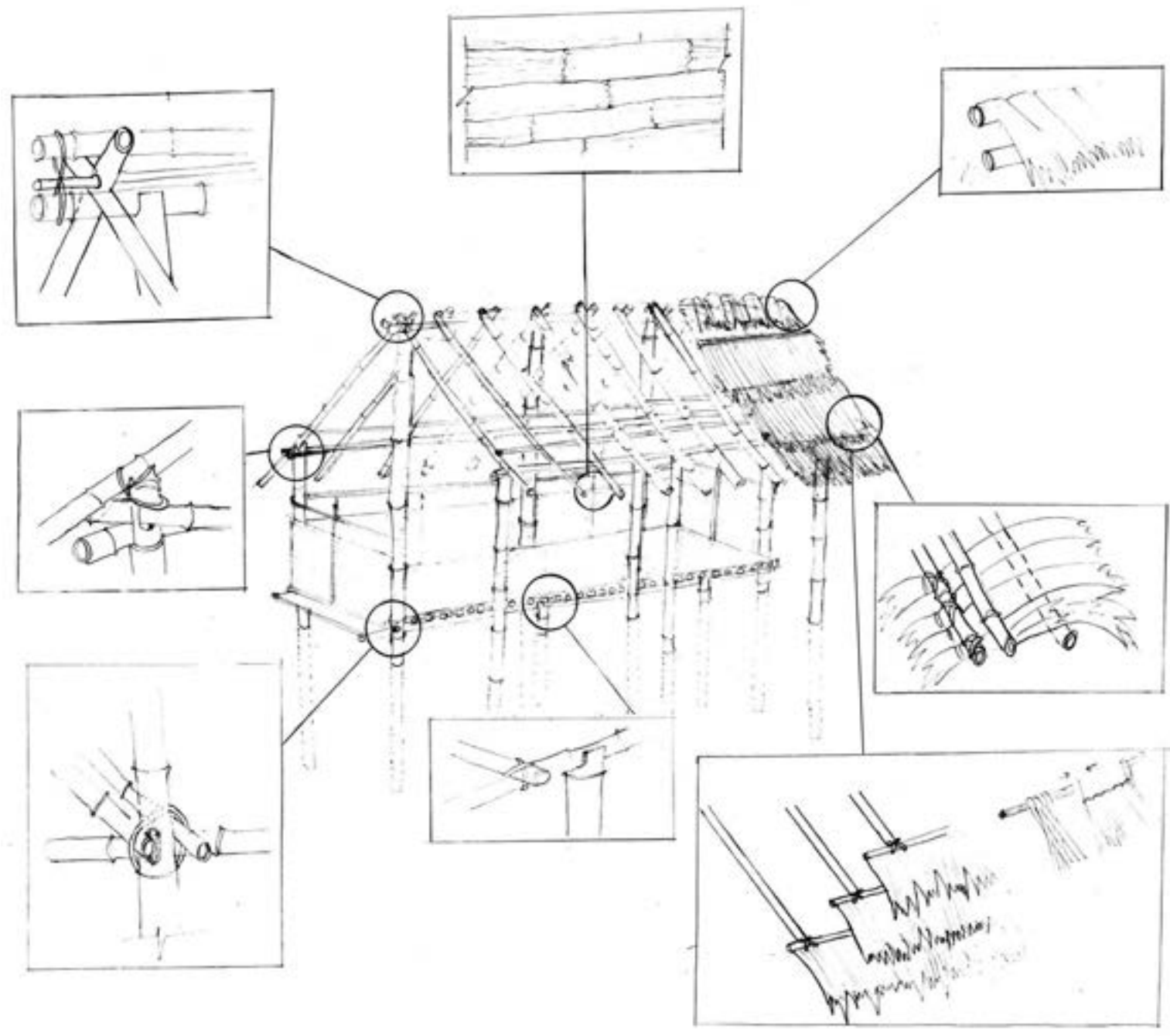


Sketch of traditional Lisu hut
