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Conditions of admission	<p>Students generally come for the second or third year of study (Bachelor's Degree) or for the first year of the Master's degree.</p> <p>Students coming for the fifth year of study. (second year of the Master's degree) will have to take courses in the Master 1 program.</p> <p>In all cases, students are required to enroll in the courses offered in the year for which they are registered. Their course of study should be compatible with the structure of the ENSA-PB program in which they are enrolled.</p> <p>ENSA-PB will only accept students with at least an intermediate level in French (B1).</p>
Language and language courses	<p>All classes are taught in French.</p> <p>We don't ask for a certificate but students must have acquired a sufficient knowledge of the French language when they arrive at the Ensa-PB.</p>
And French courses	<p>Intensive French courses will probably take place in January 2021 (remotely or at school lessons).</p> <p>Extensive French courses will take place during the second semester, from February to June 2021. French Courses are free and organized by the school.</p>

Academic calendar for the second semestre	It runs from the 8 th of February to 25 th of June, with two weeks break in April.
Pédagogical information	<p>We currently have no visibility on the evolution of the health crisis in France, so we cannot communicate with certainty the organization of the 2nd semester lessons. It is very likely that the organization will be the same as in the first semester and will be done in a hybrid form : - part of the lessons given in person (Architecture studio, tutorials) - part remotely (lectures).</p> <p>If the health situation were to develop favorably, all of the teaching would then be done in person in our school.</p>
Pédagogical registration	<p>A course registration form will be sent to students by email <u>at the beginning of December</u>. Students will be asked to classify studio and course choices in order of preference. The school cannot necessarily honor the first or second choice.</p> <p>Students are required to enroll in the courses offered in the year for which they are registered.
